Hon'ble Shri Justice Sanjay K. Agrawal**Order On Board****28/06/2017**

- (1) The petitioner has questioned the communication dated 29.04.2000 whereby supplementary bill of Rs.2,04,277.00 has been raised against him.
- (2) The petitioner, in compliance of this Court's order dated 9.8.2000, deposited 50% of the said amount and he is ready and willing to deposit the remaining amount.
- (3) Per contra, counsel for the respondents would submit that the respondents/CSPDCL is entitled for surcharge on the pending bills.
- (4) I have heard learned counsel appearing for the parties and perused

the material available on record with utmost circumspection.

(5) A careful perusal of the Order dated 9.8.2000 passed by this Court would show that this Court has directed if the petitioner deposited 50% of the amount as shown in communication dated 29.4.2000 within a week, the respondents/CSPDCL shall restore electricity supply immediately.

(6) Thus, it appears that pursuant to the order of this Court, the petitioner has already deposited 50% of the amount as shown in the communication dated 29.4.2000 and he is continuing to enjoy the facility of electricity. Since the petitioner has already deposited 50% of the amount as shown in the communication dated 29.4.2000 and he is ready and willing to deposit 50% of the amount, the writ petition stands finally disposed of with a direction to the petitioner to deposit remaining 50% of the amount within a period 10 days as shown in the communication dated 29.04.2000.

(7) However, if the said amount is not deposited by the petitioner within a period of 10 days, the respondents/CSPDCL would be entitled to proceed in accordance with law.
