1. Petitioners have preferred these writ petitions seeking a direction to the respondents to pay outstanding dues of the petitioners along with interest @ 12%.
2. Referring to the order passed by this Court in **Om Sai Traders & Tent House v. State of Chhattisgarh & others** {WPC No.2182/2015} and **Om Sai Traders & Tent House v. State of Chhattisgarh & others** {WA No.38/2015}, it is argued that the

respondents are obliged in law to make payment of the undisputed amount.

3. Considering the entire facts situation of the case and the previous orders of this Court, all the writ petitions are disposed of with a direction that in the event the petitioners prefer representation before the concerned Collector for payment of the undisputed amount within a period of one month from today, the said respondent shall consider and decide petitioners' representation for making payment of the undisputed amount by the concerned department at the earliest, preferably within a period of six weeks from the date of submission of representation.
