ORDER :

1. Leave to amend and add party.
2. Heard learned advocates for the parties.
3. Learned advocate for the petitioner states that respondents No. 3 to 14 are formally added as parties to the petition, as they were parties to the review petition filed by respondent No. 2, however, no notices of review petition have been given to those persons. In the circumstances, he does not insist upon notice to them and submits that orders be passed without issuing notice to them at the risk and peril of the petitioners.

4. After having heard learned advocates Mr. Jadhav and Mr. Karwa, without entering upon merits of the case, it would be expedient that the Maharashtra Revenue Tribunal proceeds with Review Petition No.3/C/2016/H expeditiously.

5. Learned advocate Mr. Karwa states that the matter is posted for final hearing.

6. In view of the same, writ petition is not being entertained and is disposed of. It is expected that Maharashtra Revenue Tribunal would decide on the review application within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of writ of this order. Needless to refer to that all points for the parties are kept open and shall not be construed to have been decided under this order.

7. Writ petition, as such, stands disposed of.
