

placed before an appropriate Bench.

2. The other complainants, who are aggrieved by the “B” and “C” summary reports, can very well approach this Court by filing writ petition. The PIL can be entertained only in cases where the persons or a class of persons who are unable to approach this Court. The other two complainants can very well file criminal writ petitions, if they are aggrieved by the “B” and “C” summary reports of the investigating agency. They also have an alternate remedy of filing protest petition before the Magistrate against the said “B” and “C” summary reports and the Magistrate can pass an appropriate order and decide whether said “B” and “C” summary reports submitted can be accepted or not.

3. Upon converting this criminal PIL into writ petition, matter to be placed before an appropriate Bench.
