CONSENT TERMS

1. The judgment creditor has filed the aforesaid execution application for recovery of Rs.4,80,868/- with further interest at the rate of 35% p.a. from 2nd August, 2016 till payment against the judgment debtor.
2. The judgment debtor undertakes to pay an amount of Rs.60,000/- in full and final settlement of the claim of the judgment creditor in 10 monthly equated installments of Rs.6,000/- each as under :-
 - a). The first installment would be paid on 25th April, 2017 in cash and the remaining installments would be paid by cheques on or
