Ms.Mody, learned counsel for the review petitioner states that the matter is amicably settled between the parties and the consent terms are already filed before the Debts Recovery Tribunal-II, Mumbai in Recovery Proceedings No.269/17. Insofar as Contempt Petition No.74 of 2013 is concerned, in view of the consent terms arrived at between the bank and the respondent nos. 2 and 3, the contempt proceedings are dismissed against respondent nos. 2 and 3. It is made clear that the Contempt Petition No.74 of 2013 is pending against the respondent no.1.
