In all these matters, validity of Rule 1 of the Post-
Graduate Admission Rules laid down under the Government
Resolution dated 24.10.1991 to the extent it excludes

graduates from Amravati University for being considered for grant of admission to post-graduate courses in Government Medical College/s at Nagpur, is under challenge. In several matters, interim orders were passed directing the consideration of the claim of the petitioners in accordance with merit. It is informed that some of the petitioners got admission in post-graduate courses and they have completed the same. In some of the petitions, the Court had directed one seat to be kept vacant.

The learned counsel for the petitioner/s in Writ Petition Nos. 922 and 926 both of 2000 submits that by passage of time and subsequent change in the policy of the Government for admission to post-graduate courses, the petitions have become infructuous.

Shri N.S.Rao, the learned Assistant Government Pleader also submits that subsequently there was a common entrance test prescribed for admission to the post-graduate courses in Government Medical Colleges and, by passage of time, all these petitions have become infructuous.

In view of the above, all these petitions are dismissed as infructuous.
