2. We find material placed on record by both  
the parties insufficient to conclusively fasten  
responsibility on any driver.

of the deceased in the accident. We therefore, find  
that he has got remedy of recovering compensation as

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per law before the Motor Accident Claims Tribunal. If investigation in criminal offence has not been carried out properly, it is most appropriate that a suitable private grievance is made before the concerned Judicial Magistrate First Class. Hence, with these observations and leaving all rival contentions open, we dispose of the present Writ Petition. No costs.
