Prayer:- Writ Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of a Writ of Mandamus to direct the 2nd and 3rd respondents to disburse the retirement benefits viz., Earned Leave Surrender Salary Amount of Rs.5,82,000/- Pension Commutation Amount of Rs.3,52,000/- Difference in Gratuity Amount of Rs.1,93,000/- and Settlement Arrears Amount of Rs.98,000/- the total comes to Rs.12,25,000/- (Rupees Twelve Lakhs twenty five thousand only) with 18% interest on the delayed payment to the petitioner the Checking Inspector Staff No.C12073 who has retired from service on 30.06.2014.

ORDER

By consent, the writ petition is taken up for final disposals. Ms.M.E.Raniselvam learned Additional Government pleader accepts notice on behalf of the first respondent and Mr.P. Kannan Kumar, learned Standing Counsel accepts notice on behalf of the second and third respondents.

2. The petitioner joined the services of the Pallavan Transport Corporation as a Conductor on 15.10.1981. In pursuant to the amalgamation and merger, it became Metropolitan Transport Corporation and the service of the petitioner got absorbed in that Corporation. He was upgraded as Special Grade Conductor on 01.11.2005 and after putting in 33 years of service, he retired from service on 30.06.2014 as Checking Inspector. According to the petitioner, though he retired from service, the terminal/retirement benefits have not been conferred on him. The petitioner is entitled to terminal / retirement benefits such as EL surrender salary, Settlement Arrears, Pension Commutation, Difference in gratuity. Hence, he came forward to file the present writ petition.

3. Heard the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and Ms.M.E.Raniselvam learned Additional Government Pleader appearing for the first respondent and Mr.P.Kannan Kumar, learned Standing counsel appearing for the respondents.

4. The Division Bench of this Court in Writ Appeal[MD]No.383 to 457/2015 [K.Rajendran and others Vs. The Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation, Madurai Limited rep. by the Managing Director, Madurai-10 and others] has considered the similar issue and by a common judgment dated 12.06.2015, has passed the following order.

"The learned Additional Advocate General submits that he has obtained written instructions vide letter No.7945/B/2015-2 dated 11/06/2015 that the terminal benefits of the appellants would be settled through twelve equal monthly installments, carrying interest of 6% p.a.

2. The said statement is thus taken on record and the respondents will be bound by the same. We have to keep in mind the judicial pronouncement of the Honourable Supreme Court in D.D.Tewari (D) Thr.

Lrs. Vs. Utta Haryana Bujli Vitran Nigam Limited & Ors [2014 (9) SCALE -78] wherein it is held that in case of any delay in making the payment of the installments, the interest payable would become 18% p.a., for the delayed period apart from any other remedy which may be available to the appellants for non-compliance of undertaking given to this Court.

3. The instalments to be paid from July 2015 and each instalments should be paid on or before 7th of each month.

4. The Writ Appeals are disposed of accordingly. No costs. Consequently, the connected miscellaneous petitions are closed."

5. In the light of the above facts and circumstances, the 2nd respondent is directed to settle the retiral/terminal benefits to the petitioner in twelve equal monthly installments commencing from 1st June 2017 with interest at the rate of 6% per annum and in the event of default, the interest payable will become 18% per annum. The 2nd respondent, apart from paying arrears of pension, shall also continue to pay the monthly pension amount to the petitioner on time without any default.

6. The writ petition stands disposed of with the above direction. No costs.
