ORDER

3.Under these circumstances, the respondent is directed to consider the application submitted by the writ petitioner, seeking appointment on compassionate grounds and pass orders on

merits and in accordance with law within a period of twelve weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

4. Accordingly, the writ petition stands disposed of. However, there shall be no order as to costs.

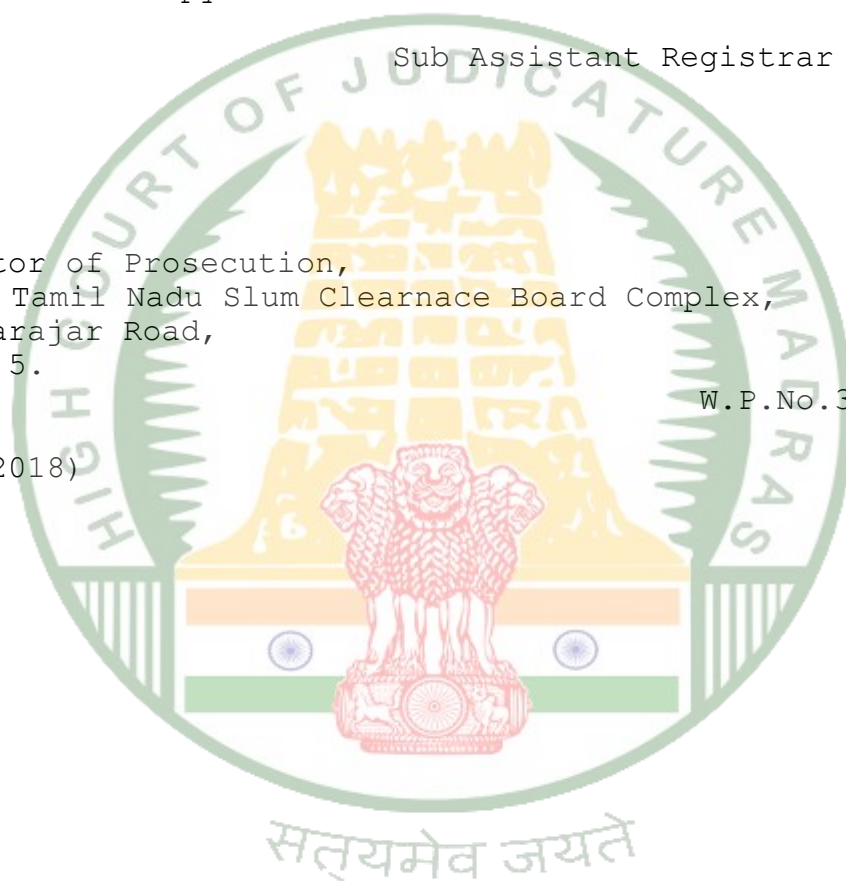
