PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner, who is arrayed as second accused, in Crime No.3 of 2016 on the file of the respondent police, apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 406 and 420 IPC and hence, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate(Crl. Side) for the respondent/State.

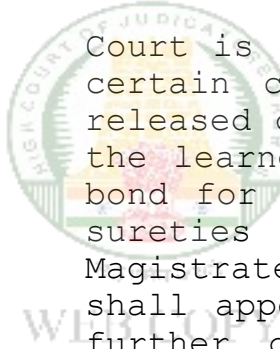
3. The case of the prosecution that on promise of arranging job, the accused got Rs.7,00,000/- from the petitioner and her husband and after receiving the amount, neither they have arranged job nor returned money.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner had no knowledge about transaction of money and the petitioner's name was falsely implicated in this case.

5. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.side) would submit that the first accused, who is the husband of the petitioner, was arrested and released on bail.

6.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the fact that A1 was arrested and released on bail, this



Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on her appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Karur and on her executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m until further orders. The petitioner shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

7.The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
