PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner, who is arrayed as A2 in Crime No.96 of 2017 on the file of the respondent police, apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 431, 379, 294(b), 307 IPC r/w 21(1) of the Mines and Minerals Act and hence, seeks anticipatory bail.

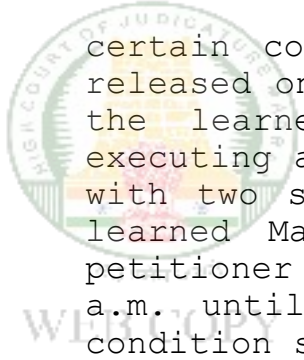
2.Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl. Side) for the respondent/State.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner along with other accused is alleged to have illegally taken river sand from the river bed and attempted to murder the defacto complainant. The petitioner is innocent. He has not committed any offence as alleged in the complaint. He has been falsely implicated in this case.

4.The learned Government Advocate appearing for the respondent / Police submitted that A1 has been arrested and he is still in prison. There is no previous case against the petitioner. The investigation is pending.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with



certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.III, Thanjavur and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders. The petitioner shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. Scrupulously.

6.The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
