PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who are arrayed as A1 to A3, in Crime No.4 of 2017 on the file of the respondent police, apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 498(A), 294(b) and 506(ii) of I.P.C. and Section 4 of Woman Harassment Act and hence, seek anticipatory bail.

2.Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned Government Advocate(Crl. Side) for the respondent/State.

3.The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the 1st petitioner is the husband and the second petitioner is the father in law and the third petitioner is the sister-in-law of the defacto complainant and they are innocent persons and H.M.O.P.No.224 of 2017 is pending between the defacto complainant and A1 and suppressing all these facts, the defacto complainant has lodged the complaint against the petitioners and they have nothing to do with the commission of offence.

4.The learned Government Advocate(Crl. Side) appearing for the respondent on instructions submitted that investigation is going on.

5.Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case,



this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioners is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Ramanathapuram and on each of them executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police as and when required. The petitioners shall comply with the condition stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

6.The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail stands dismissed.
