**ORDER**

This Criminal Original Petition is filed praying to call for the records in Crime No.247 of 2013 pending on the file of the first respondent and quash the same.

2. The petitioners and the second respondent are present before this Court along with their respective counsels. The learned Government Advocate (crl.side) appearing for the first respondent is also present.

3. The first respondent has registered the case against the petitioners in Crime No.374 of 2016, for the alleged offence under Sections 294(b), 341 and 307 of IPC., as per the complaint given



by the second respondent herein.

4. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and the second respondent would submit that, since the parties have settled their disputes amicably, the defacto complainant, who is the second respondent herein, does not want to continue the criminal proceedings against the petitioners herein. Hence, the petitioners and the second respondent are seeking indulgence of this Court to record the compromise and to quash the FIR registered, on the basis of the complaint given by the second respondent against the petitioners herein.

5. The learned Government Advocate (crl.side) appearing for the 1<sup>st</sup> respondent states that he has no objection to record the compromise, since the parties to the case compromised the issue between themselves.

6. The learned counsels appearing on either side produced the Original Aadhaar Card of the petitioners and the second respondent, for their identification. The 1<sup>st</sup> Petitioner's Aadhaar Card Number is, 6944 8499 7920; the 2<sup>nd</sup> Petitioner's Aadhaar Card Number is, 3719 2035 0628; the 3<sup>rd</sup> Petitioner's Aadhaar Card Number is, 3875 5062 9083 and the second Respondent's Aadhaar Card Number is, 6456 0087 2296.

7. The Court heard the submissions of the respective parties, who appeared before this Court and their identification is also verified by their respective counsels.

8. Since the parties have settled their disputes amicably and they have also filed a 'Joint Compromise Memo', dated 20.04.2017 to that effect, this Court is of the view that there is no need to keep the FIR in Crime No.247 of 2013, pending on the file of the first respondent herein.

9. In the light of the compromise entered into between the parties, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed and the FIR in Crime No.247 of 2013, pending on the file of the first respondent is quashed. The 'Joint Compromise Memo, dated 20.04.2017, shall form part of the order.
