PRAYER: Writ Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying for issuance of a Writ of Certiorarified Mandamus calling for the records relating to the impugned order, passed by the second respondent against the petitioner vide his proceedings in C.No. R2/150/2017 dated 07.08.2017 and to quash the same as arbitrary and consequently to direct the respondents to permit the petitioner to participate in the further course of selection process in Combined Recruitment of Grade -II Police Constables /Grade -II Jail Warders/ Firemen - 2017.

O R D E R

By consent of both parties, this writ petition itself is taken up for final disposal.

2.The petitioner, having passed S.S.L.C, applied for the post of Grade -II Police Constables / Grad-II Jail Warders / Fireman - 2017, when applications were called for by the respondent Police Department. Subsequently, after passing the written examination, the petitioner was called for for the Physical Endurance Test.

3.Now, the grievance of the petitioner appears to be that the respondents have not seen him properly while climbing the rope. As a result, he has been found disqualified.

4.In view thereof, when the matter was earlier listed before this Court, this Court directed the respondents to produce the video recordings taken at the time of measurement.

5.As per the said direction, the learned Additional Advocate General appearing for the respondent Police Department produced the video recordings and the same was played before me in the presence of the learned counsel on either side and also the petitioner.

6.A perusal of the video recordings would go to show that the petitioner was not able to climb half of the rope and on his own he came down from the rope. Therefore, the petitioner is rightly found disqualified by the respondent Police Department.

7. Accordingly, the Writ Petition stands dismissed. No costs. Consequently, the connected Miscellaneous Petitions are closed.
