The Court made the following:

ORDER: (*per Hon'ble Sri Justice C.V.Nagarjuna Reddy*)

This Writ Petition is filed for a *Mandamus* to declare the action of respondent No.1 in collecting advance tax of Rs.1,47,197/-, and penalty of Rs.1,47,197/- on the ground that the vehicle number is written with pen on the CST advance waybill issued by the petitioner for movement of goods from Haridwar, Uttarakhand to Vijayawada, as illegal and arbitrary.

The petitioner averred that he was forced to pay the aforementioned tax and penalty for release of the goods.

Mr. Shaik Jeelani Basha, learned Special Standing Counsel for Commercial Taxes (Andhra Pradesh), submitted that since the petitioner is disputing its liability to pay the advance tax and penalty, appropriate proceedings will be initiated and an assessment order will be passed after complying with the procedural requirements of issuing show cause notice, calling for explanation, etc.

Inasmuch as the goods have already been released and the liability of the petitioner is required to be determined, the Writ Petition is disposed of with the direction to respondent No.1 to complete the assessment proceedings after giving the petitioner an opportunity of being heard, pass appropriate order and communicate the same to the petitioner within two months

from the date of receipt of a copy of this order. If the petitioner feels aggrieved by any order that may be passed by respondent No.1, it shall be free to avail appropriate legal remedy in accordance with law.

As a sequel, WPMP.No.16911 of 2016 shall stand dismissed as infructuous.
