Writ Petition Nos.2925, 2933, 2941, 2959 and 3000 of 2017

COMMON ORDER: (*per Hon'ble Sri Justice V. Ramasubramanian*)

Both Sri P. Kamalakar, learned counsel for the petitioners and Sri Shaik Jeelani Basha, learned Special Standing Counsel for commercial Taxes, would agree that, instead of keeping the writ petitions pending on the file of this court, it would suffice if this court were to permit the respondents to conduct an enquiry, give the petitioners an opportunity of being heard, and thereafter pass a final order in accordance with the Circular of the commissioner dated 15.09.2015.

2. We consider it appropriate, in such circumstances, to dispose of all the writ petitions, directing the 4th respondent to put the petitioners on notice, give them an opportunity of being heard and thereafter pass orders, in accordance with law, at the earliest and, in any event, not later than two months from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

3. All the above writ petitions are disposed of accordingly. No order as to costs. Miscellaneous petitions pending, if any, in these writ petitions, shall stand disposed of.
