ORDER:

Crl.P.M.P.Nos.11605 and 11606 of 2017

These miscellaneous petitions are filed under Section 482 of Criminal Procedure Code (for short "Cr.P.C.") seeking leave to compromise the matter and compound the offence punishable under Sections 498-A, 406 and 420 of Indian Penal Code (for short "I.P.C.") and under Sections 4 and 6 of Dowry Prohibition Act, as the matter is settled outside the Court and they entered into compromise and filed joint memo to that effect.

Complainant and the petitioners/accused are also present and they are identified by their counsel and Public Prosecutor, produced Photostat copies of aadhar cards in proof of their identity. When the terms and conditions of compromise are explained in English language, they are admitted to be true and correct.

On enquiry the parties stated that they settled the issue outside the Court due to intervention of elders and well-wishers and they intend to lead peaceful life.

The offence punishable under Section 498-A of I.P.C. though not compoundable, it can be compounded with the permission of the Court.

In view of the close relationship between the parties and as the offence committed by the petitioners is not against the society and the compromise is voluntary, I find that it is a fit case to grant permission to compound the offence. Hence, compromise is recorded in terms of the joint memo filed along with the compromise petition. Accordingly, the petitions are ordered.

Crl.P.No.10435 Of 2017

In view of the orders passed in Crl.P.M.P.Nos.11605 and 11606 of 2017, the present petition is allowed in terms of the joint compromise memo filed by both parties. No costs.

Registry is directed to annex a copy of the joint memo filed by both parties, to this order.

Consequently, miscellaneous applications pending if any, shall stand dismissed.
