JASWANT SINGH, J. (Oral)

The petitioner, son of Jagtar Singh (since deceased), asserts that the order dated 20.07.2009 (**Annexure P-2**), passed by this Court in CWP No.8086 of 2008, whereby it was provided that if the LRs of Jagtar Singh (since deceased) apprehend any danger to the possession or the crops of their land at the hands of Jasvir Singh s/o Balkar Singh and Gurmeet Singh s/o Lakhwinder Singh, both r/o Village Dholewala Kalan, Tehsil & District Moga, they would have an independent right to raise their grievance before the authorities concerned.

By filing the present contempt petition, the petitioner urges that the land described in Para 2 of the contempt petition, measuring 98 Kanals and 17 Marlas is in the cultivating possession of the petitioner and his brother-Tarlok Singh. The aforesaid Jasvir Singh and Gurmeet Singh are threatening to dispossess them.

Upon notice, replies have been filed, wherein it is stated that on proper enquiry, it has been found that the said land belongs to the Central Government and is in the unauthorized possession of Jasvir Singh and Gurmeet Singh, therefore, no case for any alleged violation of the order dated 20.07.2009 (P-2) is made out.

At the time of hearing, learned Counsel for the petitioner prays for permission to withdraw the present contempt petition to enable his client to seek remedy in accordance with law.

Accordingly, the present contempt petition stands dismissed as withdrawn with the aforesaid liberty.
