JASWANT SINGH, J. (Oral)

The petitioner had filed CWP No.7660 of 2015 seeking regularization of his services on the strength of policy of the State dated 01.10.2003, which entitled the regularization of services of all employees in service for a period of three years till 30.09.2003. The said petition was allowed with a direction to the respondents to consider the case of the petitioner for regularization of his services in terms of the prevailing policy of the State, with all consequential benefits. Since the needful was not done within the stipulated time, hence the present contempt petition.

Upon notice, reply has been filed asserting that the services of the petitioner stands regularized w.e.f. 01.10.2003 vide office order dated 11.08.2016 (**Annexure R-2**), however, all the consequential benefits in the form of arrears etc. remain to be released.

At the time of hearing, learned State Counsel submits that all the consequential benefits etc. have also been released to the petitioner, which is not disputed by learned Counsel for the petitioner.

In view of the above, no further action is warranted.

Accordingly, the present contempt petition stands dismissed as infructuous.
