On the last date of hearing, following order was passed in this
case:-

“Learned counsel representing respondents submit that orders passed by writ court have been complied with in letter and spirit. According to Mr. Manchanda 661 employees were available with Haryana State Federation of Cooperative Sugar Mills. Out of them 172 have been adjusted. He further submits that it is an on going process and the Federation would proceed in accordance with the directions given by writ court in future as well.

In view of above, it appears that present petition has been rendered infructuous and needs to be dismissed as such. Learned counsel for the petitioner, however, prays for a short adjournment on the ground that arguing counsel for the petitioners is in personal difficulty.

Adjourned to 19.05.2017.”

It has been reiterated by the State counsel today that the order of the writ court shall be complied with in letter and spirit. It would be ensured that whenever a vacancy arises, there is no delay in filling up the same.

In view of above, no cause of action survives in this petition. Same is disposed of. Rule is discharged. Petitioners shall be entitled to seek revival of the petition in case any cause of action arises at some stage.
