The criminal petition bearing *CRM-M No. 5670 of 2016* filed by the petitioner, seeking directions to the official respondents to complete the investigation in FIR No. 269, dated 16.11.2015, for offences under Sections 323, 34, 341 and 506 of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Narwana, District Jind, as also to submit the final report in this regard in accordance with sub-Section (1) of Section 173 Cr.P.C., was disposed of vide order dated 17.02.2016 (**Annexure P-1**) *with a direction to the Superintendent of Police, Jind, to decide the representation (Annexure P-3) in accordance with law within one month on receipt of certified copy of the order.*

Since the needful was not done within the prescribed time,
hence the present contempt.

Upon notice, reply on behalf of respondent has been filed, wherein in para No. 5, it is stated that on representation of the petitioner, enquiry has been got conducted through a Gazetted Officer (ASP Narwana, an IPS Officer) and after enquiry, the same has been considered and filed vide order dated 27.05.2016 (**Annexure R-2**).

In view of above, learned State Counsel states that the order dated 17.02.2016 (**P-1**) stands complied with, therefore, no further action in the present contempt is warranted as the same has become infructuous.

Dismissed as infructuous.
