In the writ petition bearing CWP No. 9382 of 2016 filed by the petitioner, this Court vide order dated 19.05.2016 (**Annexure P-1**) passed the following operative directions:-

“Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of, without issuing notice to the respondents, with a direction to respondent No.5- Tehsildar-cum-Executive Magistrate, Tehsil Dhuri, Sangrur, to take a decision on the representation dated 05.11.2015 (Annexure P-13), in accordance with law, preferably within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and copy of the order so passed shall be communicated forthwith to the petitioner.”

Upon notice, separate replies on behalf of respondent Nos. 1 to 4 have been filed. In reply of respondent No. 4 at para No. 3, it is stated that in compliance of the order dated 19.05.2016 (**P-1**), representation dated 05.11.2015 of the petitioner has been disposed of by passing order dated 17.10.2016 (**Annexure R-4/1T**), as the possession of the land in dispute stands delivered to the petitioner on 13.10.2016. A copy of the said order dated 17.10.2016 (**R-4/1T**) has also been supplied to the petitioner.

In view of the above, no further action in the contempt is warranted, accordingly, present contempt petition stands dismissed as infructuous.
