Notice of motion.

On asking of the court, Mr. H.S. Sethi, Addl. Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice.

Petitioner alleges violation of order dated 25.05.2017, passed by this court, operative part of which reads as under:-

“This petition is disposed of, at this stage, with a direction that State Transport Commissioner, Punjab shall consider the factual and legal aspects raised in legal notice Annexure P-5 dated 22.03.2017, by passing a speaking order, within a period of two months after the receipt of certified copy of this order and would communicate the order to the petitioner.”

Mr. Sethi, learned State counsel at the outset submits that in case the order is not already complied with, a speaking order shall be passed at the earliest, in any case not later than two months.

In view of statement made by learned State counsel, no further direction is necessary. However, in case petitioner moves this court again

on the contempt side, this court shall consider imposition of exemplary costs which shall be deducted from the salary of the officer/official(s) responsible for the delay in complying with the order.
