Petitioner has preferred the instant contempt petition under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act seeking initiation of contempt proceedings against the respondent for violating the order dated 23.07.2016 (P-1) passed by this Court in CWP No.14465 of 2014 whereby respondent was directed to release the pension and other pensionary benefits to the petitioner within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

Upon notice reply on behalf of the respondent-State has been filed wherein it is stated that the pensionary benefits have been released to the petitioner and the proposal for allowing pension and DCRG was submitted to the competent authority i.e. Accountant General, Punjab which

was sanctioned vide letter dated 3.4.2017 issued by the said office. Amount of GIS i.e. Rs.30,372/- has been paid and the pension and DCRG is to be released by the District Treasury Officer, Amritsar.

In response Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that the present petition may be disposed of as infructuous.

In view of the above stand of the State in its reply, nothing survives in the present contempt which is hereby dismissed as infructuous. However, it is hoped that the necessary payments are not unnecessarily delayed failing which the petitioner will be entitled to revive the present petition.
