The writ petition filed by the petitioner was allowed on 19.03.2015 with a direction to the respondents to pay interest @ 9% on the retiral benefits within a period of four months from the date of receipt of copy of the order.

In the reply, it has been stated by the respondents that all the benefits including the interest have been granted, whereas learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the interest has been paid after expiry of period of six months.

There is nothing on record to show as to when copy of the order was supplied. The period for compliance of the order was four months and, thereafter, petitioner was held entitled for interest.

The contempt petition is disposed of, accordingly.

However, in case the petitioner is aggrieved in any manner, he is at liberty to make a representation within a period of one month from today and in case such representation is made, the respondents are directed to consider the same and pass necessary order in accordance with law within a period of two months thereafter.
