Learned State counsel submits that the claim of the petitioner has been considered and payment has also been released to him, whereas, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that there is a long delay in releasing the payment and hence, the petitioner is also entitled for interest on the delayed amount.

In view of submissions made by learned counsel for the parties and since the compliance of order is there, the present petition is disposed of.

As far as claim of interest is concerned, the petitioner is at liberty to make representation for claiming interest on the delayed amount within a period of two weeks from today and the respondents are directed to consider the said representation moved by the petitioner and pass necessary order in accordance with law within a period of one month thereafter.

The contempt petition is disposed of accordingly.
