Petitioners have filed the present contempt petition under Section 11 & 12 of the Contempt of Court Act 1971 read with Article 215 of the Constitution for violating the order dated 06.07.2015 passed by this Court in CWP No.12757 of 2015 (**P-1**) whereby respondents were directed to consider and decide the claim of the petitioner as set out in their representation dated 22.01.2015 (**P-13**) strictly in accordance with law within a period of three months from the receipt of certified copy of the order by passing a speaking order assigning the reasons in support of decision arrived at by them. Since compliance of the order was not made, hence the present contempt petition.

Upon notice learned Counsel for the respondent-State submits

that the present contempt petition has become infructuous as the claim of

the petitioners as set out in their representation dated 22.01.2015 (P-13) has been decided and necessary relief has been granted.

In response, learned Counsel for the petitioners submits that the order dated 06.07.2015 (P-1) has not been fully complied with as the complete consequential benefits in terms of the speaking order have not been released.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition is dismissed as infructuous. Respondents are directed to release complete consequential benefits in terms of the speaking order expeditiously.
