There were partition proceedings initiated between the petitioner and his co-sharers with regard to some agricultural land situated in Village Bamber, Tehsil and District Rewari. Inspite of the Appellate Authority having passed an order dated 10.03.2014 staying the partition proceedings, the Assistant Collector, IInd Grade, Rewari proceeded to confirm *Naksha Zeen* and issued the instrument of partition (*Sanad Taksim*) vide order dated 24.03.2014. The said proceedings were taken before the Revisional Jurisdiction wherein the learned Financial Commissioner vide order dated 16.10.2014 (P-7) set aside the orders dated 24.03.2014 while ordering the District Collector Rewari to conduct an inquiry into the matter regarding the misconduct of the Assistant Collector and accordingly make a reference.

Since the inquiry was conducted by District Revenue Officer instead of the Collector, the present contempt petition was filed.

At the time of hearing learned State Counsel on instructions from Mr. Krishan Kumar, Naib Tehsildar submits that after the first inquiry conducted by the DRO a fresh inquiry as directed has been conducted by the Deputy Commissioner-cum-Collector, Rewari and report dated 15.02.2017 has been submitted to the learned Financial Commissioner for taking appropriate action.

Thus it is conceded that no further proceedings are warranted in the present contempt petition.

In view of the above, present contempt petition is dismissed as infructuous.
