JASWANT SINGH, J.(ORAL)

Petitioner has preferred the instant contempt petition under Section 12 of the Contempt of Court Act read with Article 215 of the Constitution against the respondents for an alleged violation of order dated 19/01/2015 (**P-1**) passed by this court in CWP No. 25811 of 2012.

It is contended by learned Counsel for the petitioner that the benefit which the petitioner is entitled to, of 2 years, has not been released to him despite specific direction given by this court in the above captioned writ petition which was disposed of in terms of the order passed by Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 16/09/2014 in Civil Appeal No. 8855 of 2014 titled as State of Punjab Versus Bhupinder Singh.

On 9th of November 2016, this court had directed the

Respondents to give calculation with regard to benefits which have been

released to the petitioner within a period of 2 weeks and supply the same to petitioner. Further, State was directed to verify the grievance raised by the petitioner as observed in the order dated 9th of November 2016. In pursuance to the said directions, the State has filed an affidavit of Director Public Instructions (school), PSEB, wherein calculations have been submitted and it has been prayed that all the benefits which were due to the petitioner have already been released.

Since, the order passed by this court in CWP No. 25811 of 2012 dated 19/01/2015 stands substantially complied with, this court is of the opinion that nothing survives in the present contempt petition. However, petitioner is at liberty to revive this contempt petition, in case any other benefit which the petitioner is entitled to remains pending.

Disposed of in the above terms.
