There are 30 petitioners-retirees who were claiming the revised retiral benefits in terms of the order dated 05.01.2012.

It is a conceded position that claim of 29 petitioners except Sh. Charanjit Singh (petitioner no.8) entire arrears of the retiral benefits have been released. The bills relating to the petitioner no.8 are pending in the treasury and the required payments are expected to be paid shortly.

In view of the aforesaid stand, contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous. The respondents are bound by their statement qua petitioner no.8.
