The four petitioners, namely, Puran Mal Sharma, Rattan Singh Malik, Jai Pal and Yash Pal Kundu had filed writ petitions seeking benefit of counting of their previous service for Aided Schools towards counting of their pensionary benefits on retirement from the Government Schools under the Education Department, Haryana.

The writ petitions were decided in favour of the petitioners and a direction was issued to finalize their claims including adjustment of the share of the petitioners towards Contributory Provident Fund applicable during their tenures with the Aided Schools. Since there was a delay in implementing the directions, they had filed the present contempt petition. Before the previous date of hearing on 16.11.2016, all the outstanding reliefs stood extended to three petitioners except Yash Pal Kundu. Thus, qua three of them, the contempt petition has become infructuous.

At the time of hearing today, learned State Counsel on instructions from Sh. Narender Rana, Assistant, O/o Director, Elementary Education, Haryana, submits that the outstanding claims of even the said Yash Pal Kundu have since been released after adjustment.

In response, learned Counsel for the petitioners states that he has no reason to disbelieve the statement made by learned State Counsel at bar.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous. In case, anything is factually incorrect, the petitioners would be free to revive the contempt petition.
