JASWANT SINGH, J.(ORAL)

The petitioner has a matrimonial dispute with her husband Saurabh Chopra and her in-laws. She alleges that her husband and in-laws have been harassing her and giving beatings for bring insufficient dowry and the police was taking no action inspite of complaint made by her. Petitioner was constrained to file CRM-M No.16826 of 2016 which was disposed of vide order dated 27.05.2016 (**P-1**) directing the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana to look into the complaint and take necessary action in accordance with law. Since no action has been taken hence the present contempt has been filed.

After hearing learned Counsel for the petitioner, this Court is of the opinion that no case for willful disobedience is made out. It is conceded that an enquiry has been marked and is pending investigation. Even otherwise the petitioner has the remedy to approach under Section 156(3)

Cr.PC for redressal of her grievance.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition is hereby dismissed.
