JASWANT SINGH, J (ORAL)

Counsel for the petitioner contends that the Passport Officer has violated the order dated 08.12.2016 whereby he was directed to look into the grievance raised by him in his representation dated 09.10.2015 within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order. As the needful has not been done, present contempt has been filed.

Counsel for the petitioner heard.

The petitioner is praying for change of date of birth recorded in his Passport as 11.10.1987 in light of one recorded in his matriculation certificate and subsequent Educational Qualification Certificates. The prayer for change is based on his date of birth recorded as 22.12.1989 in his birth certificate issued by the office of Registrar of Births, Ludhiana. The

petitioner has failed to show any provision whereby the date of birth so recorded in the matriculation certificate and the passport can be changed merely by adducing the birth certificate. The proper course would be for seeking a decree against the quarters concerned before the office of passport office can accept the change of date of birth.

In view of the above, no ground for interference is made out.

Dismissed.
