Feeling aggrieved against the order dated 28.11.2013 (Annexure P-5) passed by the learned trial Court and the order dated 11.02.2014 (Annexure P-8) passed by the learned Additional District Judge, whereby application of the plaintiffs-respondents under Order 39 Rules 1 and 2 of the Code of Civil Procedure was allowed, defendants have approached this Court by way of present civil revision petition under Article 227 of the Constitution of India, for setting

aside the impugned orders.

Notice of motion was issued and in the meantime, parties were directed to maintain status quo vide order dated 14.03.2014 passed by this Court.

Present revision petition is pending before this Court for the last more than three years. Civil suit itself might have decided or must be close to its conclusion, however, learned counsel for the respondents are not aware about the status of the case. Further, none of learned counsel for the respondents has pointed out as to how the abovesaid orders of status quo granted by this Court is causing any harm to anybody.

In view of the above and without commenting anything on merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, present revision petition is disposed of, with a direction that the parties shall maintain status quo during pendency of the civil suit, if the same is not already decided by the learned trial Court.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present civil revision petition stands disposed of.
