JASPAL SINGH, J. (Oral)

By virtue of instant civil revision petition preferred under Article 227 of the Constitution of India, the petitioner has sought setting aside of order dated 13.01.2017 passed by Additional District Judge, Amritsar, in case No. 663/2016 titled as “*Vikas Thukral vs. Ranjana Thukral*” whereby while disposing of an application under Section 24 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 (for short, “Act”), the petitioner has been directed to pay ₹1,00,000/- per month as maintenance allowance i.e. ₹65,000/- to respondent No.1 and ₹35,000/- to respondent No.2, during the pendency of divorce petition filed by petitioner under Section 13 of the Act.

2. At the very outset of the arguments, it has been pointed out by learned counsel for the parties that an oral settlement has been arrived at

between the parties to the instant petition, according to which, the petitioner has undertaken to bear all the expenses to be incurred by his son-Kavish (respondent No.2) whereas respondent No.1-wife has no objection, in case, the maintenance of ₹65,000/- per month awarded to her by lower court is reduced to a sum of ₹20,000/-.

3. In view of the statements suffered by both the parties in the presence of their respective counsel, the instant petition is disposed of with modification that the maintenance allowance awarded vide order dated 13.01.2017 to the respondent No.1-wife to the tune of ₹65,000/- stands reduced to ₹20,000/- per month from the date of filing of application under Section 24 of the Act. However, the entire expenses for the up-liftment as well as education of the minor child i.e. respondent No.2-Kavish shall be borne by the petitioner.
