Learned counsel for the petitioners, at the very outset, fairly states that since suit filed by the plaintiff-respondent (wrongly typed as defendant), has been dismissed in default by learned trial court, present revision petition would not survive at this stage and the same may be disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous. However, liberty may be granted to the petitioner to approach this Court again, if necessity arises, particularly after revival of the suit, which stands dismissed in default as on date.

In view of the abovesaid statement made by learned counsel for the petitioners, present revision petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous, however, with liberty as prayed for.
