Petitioner-husband has filed the present revision petition against order passed by the learned Additional District Judge, Rewari while deciding application under Section 24 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.

Husband has challenged the order vide which the wife has been granted maintenance pendente lite at the rate of Rs.3,000/- per month; besides, litigation expenses of Rs.10,000/-.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the husband is taking care of a disabled child and is getting him treated in PGIMS, Rohtak.

Counsel for the petitioner has further submitted that in view of the ailment of the son, petitioner is not able to earn anything.

I have considered the submission of learned counsel for the petitioner.

It is not in dispute that respondent is a legally wedded wife of petitioner. It is stated by the wife in the petition that husband is drawing handsome salary of Rs.40,000/- per month. It is further submitted that he has ancestral property in village Gokalgarh. Considering all aspects of the

matter, the trial court has granted maintenance pendente lite at the rate of

Rs.3,000/-.

No doubt, certain documents have been produced on the file to prove that the petitioner is visiting the hospital for treatment of his son Vihan. However, that itself cannot be a ground to deny the maintenance pendente lite to the wife. The learned trial Court has fixed maintenance at the rate of Rs.3,000/- per month only.

Taking into consideration the facts available on the file, I do not find any reason to interfere with the order passed by the Court below.

Accordingly, the revision petition is dismissed.
