Application for listing the main case has been filed.

The main case is already listed at Sr. No.860 on the regular
board before this Court.

Accordingly, keeping in view the above, the application is
allowed. The main revision petition is taken on board today itself.

Main case

The petitioner is in revision against the order of eviction passed
by the Courts below. It is pointed out by Mr. Jain that a compromise has
been arrived at and a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) dated
07.03.2017 has been executed *inter se* the petitioner and wife of the
deceased landlord. The petitioner has vacated the premises as undertaken
before 15.04.2017 and has received a sum of ₹6 lakhs for rehabilitation and
re-settlement and, accordingly, the present revision petition is to be
withdrawn.

As per Clause-4 of the said MOU, a sum of ₹3,000/- per month has been deposited as mesne profits with the Rent Controller, Ludhiana, in view of the order dated 06.11.2013 passed by this Court.

Resultantly, it has been agreed between the parties that both the petitioner and Mrs. Vimal Chopra will be entitled to withdraw the amount, which will be divided equally between both of them.

Accordingly, the compromise/MOU in original is taken on record and the present revision petition is disposed of in the abovesaid terms.
