This order shall dispose of eight civil revision petitions bearing CR No.3920 to 3922 and 3930 to 3934 of 2017 as all these revision petitions arise out of similar set of facts.

When this matter came up for hearing on 31.5.2017, following order was passed by this Court:-

“It is a matter of record that as per preliminary decree dated 29.11.2005 (Annexure P-1), at page 41 of the paper book, the learned trial Court directed the petitioners-judgment debtors to render the accounts within a period of three months.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners challenged this decree before the higher Courts, but it had attained finality against the petitioners-judgment debtors and they did not render any accounts.

It is also a matter of record that consequent upon the abovesaid preliminary decree (Annexure P-1), final decree dated 18.12.2012 (Annexure P-2) was passed by the learned

trial Court. The decree has become final against the petitioners, as their regular second appeal came to be dismissed by this Court, however, learned counsel for the petitioners seeks time to place on record the judgment passed by this Court.

On his request, adjourned to 20.07.2017.

A photocopy of this order be placed on the files of other connected cases.”

Learned counsel for the petitioners, at the very outset, fairly states that he could not ensure strict compliance of the above-said order dated 31.5.2017 passed by this court for want of relevant documents.

In view of the above, all the civil revision petitions are disposed of, however, with liberty to the petitioners to file fresh revision petitions on the same cause of action but only after ensuring strict compliance of the above-said order dated 31.5.2017 passed by this Court.

Disposed of, accordingly.
