RAJ MOHAN SINGH, J (oral)

On 15.9.2016, following order was passed by this
Court:-

“ Counsel for the petitioner has submitted
that the petitioner is ready to pay the decretal amount
by way of easy instalments in order to save her only
residential house that has been attached in execution
of the decree for recovery passed in favour of the
respondent. It is further submitted that the petitioner
shall deposit an amount of Rs. 50,000/- out of the
decretal amount with the Executing Court by

15.10.2016.

Notice of motion for 22.11.2016.

Auction of the attached property shall be kept in abeyance only in case the petitioner deposits an amount of Rs. 50,000/- with the Executing Court on or before 15.10.2016 and the same shall be released in favour of the decree holder. In case, such a deposit is made, she will submit an application alongwith her affidavit supported by a document regarding deposit of Rs. 50,000/- with the Registry of the Court and notice to the respondent would be issued only on necessary compliance by the petitioner. A copy of the order be appended alongwith notice so that the respondent can appear in person.”

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the respondent submits that the respondent has already received an amount of ₹ 50,000/- out of the decretal amount as ordered by this Court on 15.9.2016.

In view of nature of controversy involved in the case, it would be appropriate to direct the petitioner to pay the remaining decretal amount in three equal instalments commencing from 22nd December. Second installment

would become due after a period of two months from today and so on. If the aforesaid arrangement is flouted by the petitioner the respondent would be entitled to execute the decree in accordance with law.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
