By this common order, I shall be disposing of CR Nos.6865, 6866, 6867 and 6905 of 2017 as common issue is involved.

The plaintiffs are in revision petition against the order passed by the learned trial Court permitting playing of Compact Discs (CDs) Ex.P17 to P20 to confront the same to the plaintiffs during the course of cross-examination.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has vehemently argued that earlier such request was declined and, therefore, it was not permissible for the Court to review its own order.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has brought attention of this Court to the orders dated 27.09. 2016 and 21.02.2017. A reading of the aforesaid orders would show that the application filed by the State was dismissed on the first occasion i.e. on 27.09.2016 as the same was found to be vague. On the second occasion i.e. on 21.02.2017, the Court had

dismissed the application at that stage.

The Compact Discs contain digital data. These documents have already been admitted in evidence. The defendants feel that playing of such Compact Discs is necessary for cross-examination of the witness.

In the present case, the Court has exercised its discretion while allowing the request. The earlier orders passed by the Court were not on merits.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, there is no scope for interference in the order passed by the learned trial Court.

The revision petitions are dismissed.
