TEJINDER SINGH DHINDSA, J.

Petitioner, Mohinder Singh instituted the present writ petition in the year 2000.

As per pleadings on record, petitioner was initially selected and appointed as Helper under the Department of Transport, State of Punjab on 04.05.1978. He, thereafter, earned promotions as Assistant Fitter on 12.06.1978 and Fitter on 21.06.1980.

The precise claim raised in the instant petition was as regards pay parity with private respondent No.4, namely, Resham Singh and who was alleged to be junior to the petitioner.

Learned State counsel, who is on instructions from Ashok Kumar, Record Keeper, Law Branch, Punjab Roadways apprises the Court that the petitioner as well as private respondent No.4 have since expired. Petitioner is stated to have died way back on 07.07.2003.

Against such factual premise, the instant petition is disposed of

as having been rendered infructuous.

Suffice it to observe that it would be open for the legal heirs of deceased/petitioner, Mohinder Singh to move an appropriate application to seek revival and pursue the prayer in the petition, if so advised and upon demonstrating that any cause of action and grievance still survives.
