Through this petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, prayer has been made for quashing F.I.R. No.33 dated 05.03.2017 under Sections 452, 379, 323, 427, 506, 148 and 149 I.P.C. pertaining to Police Station Gate Hakima, District Amritsar, on the basis of compromise Annexure P-2.

On presentation of the petition, vide order dated 28.03.2017, the petitioners were directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate on 05.04.2017 with direction to the Magistrate to summon respondents No.2 to 4 also and record the statements of the parties for compromise with further direction to the Magistrate to furnish report alongwith the recorded statements qua veracity of the compromise, if any, between the parties.

Consequently, the parties appeared before the Judicial

statements for compromise. Report bearing No.203 dated 12.05.2017 from the concerned Magistrate duly forwarded by learned District and Sessions Judge, Amritsar vide Endst. No.4351R dated 16.05.2017 has also been received.

According to the report of Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Amritsar, the compromise between the parties is genuine, voluntary without any threat, undue influence or coercion.

In view of the totality of the facts and circumstances and considering the fact that the compromise will bring harmony in relations between the parties, the aforesaid F.I.R. No.33 qua the petitioners, is hereby quashed.

Petition is disposed of accordingly.
