LISA GILL, J.

The petitioner, who is the father-in-law of the complainant, seeks the concession of anticipatory bail in FIR No. 60 dated 14.03.2017 registered under Sections 323, 354A, 506, 509 IPC at Women Police Station, District Gurugram.

It is contended that the petitioner's son and the complainant were married on 05.03.2011. They are blessed with two children. No problem had ever arisen till the filing of the present FIR. In fact, the complainant wants to reside separately with her husband and children. It is due to this reason that the above said FIR has been registered. Moreover, the petitioner has joined investigation in this case.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from SI Raj Bala verifies that the petitioner has joined investigation. His custodial interrogation in this case is not required.

There are no allegations on behalf of the State that the petitioner is likely to abscond or that he is likely to dissuade the witnesses from deposing true facts in the Court, if released on bail.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances noted above but without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, it is considered just and expedient to allow this petition. Consequently, order dated 07.04.2017 is made absolute.
