Heard forthwith with the consent of learned counsel for the rival parties.

This is a petition for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in FIR No.167 dated 25.10.2016, under Sections 302, 148, 149 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Beas, District Amritsar.

With the assistance of learned counsel for the rival parties, I have perused the FIR.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that there is unfortunate death of the father of the complainant due to assault and therefore, at any rate, no case is made out to hold prima-facie, any murder.

Looking to the allegations in the FIR, I find that petitioner

No.2-Ranjit Kaur @ Rano had raised *lalkara* and nothing more that.

Hence, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to petitioner No.2-
Ranjit Kaur @ Rano.

In so far as other petitioners No.1 and 3 are concerned, I think, there is overt act on their part. Hence, I am not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to them.

In that view of the matter, petition qua petitioner No.2-
Ranjit Kaur @ Rano is allowed and she shall be released on anticipatory bail on her furnishing bail bonds amounting to ₹10,000/- with one surety of like amount, subject to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned who may impose such conditions as deem fit and proper. Petition qua petitioners No.1 and 3 for grant of anticipatory bail stands dismissed. However, petitioners No.1 and 3 are at liberty to apply for regular bail before the trial Court, in view of the peculiar nature of the facts. In case, such application for regular bail is filed by them before the trial Court, the trial Court shall consider and decide the same within one week from the date of its filing.

Petition stands disposed of, accordingly.
