Petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking issuance of necessary directions to respondents No.1 to 3 to take a final call in pursuance of cancellation report dated 16.12.2012.

Petitioner alleges that case bearing FIR No.87 dated 06.11.2011 was registered against him on the statement of respondent No.4 for the offence under Section 304 IPC in Police Station, Ajitwal, District Moga. The case was investigated by the police with reference to post-mortem report and viscera. No cognizable offence was found to have been committed by the petitioner. A cancellation report was prepared on 16.12.2012.

The grievance of the petitioner is that despite preparation of cancellation report, the police action has not

been culminated to the logical end. In the aforesaid context, petitioner has already moved a representation dated 20.08.2016 to respondent No.2 but no action has been taken till date.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Shilesh Gupta, Additional A.G., Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3.

At this stage, in view of nature of order which this Court proposes to pass, there is no necessity of filing any reply to the petition as no order prejudicial to interest of any of the party is being passed.

This petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3 to take lawful action on the complaint/representation of the petitioner in the context of culmination of cancellation report prepared by the police. It would be appreciated if the action is taken within reasonable time and complainant is informed accordingly.
