INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioners-Daljit Kaur and Bimla alias Bimaljeet Kaur have filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.68 dated 23.12.2016, registered at Police Station Valtoha, District Tarn Taran, under Section 304 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and the complainant has also put in appearance on behalf of the complainant. They contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that allegations against the petitioners are that petitioner-Bimla alias Bimaljeet Kaur gave a push to Swaran Singh and petitioner-Daljit Kaur and his mother Daljit Kaur also shown brick to the deceased. As a result of the same, Swaran Singh became perplexed; fell down on the ground and died at the spot. No injury on the person of deceased has been attributed to anybody.

The petitioners have been in custody since 24.12.2016. They are not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
