DEEPAK SIBAL J. (ORAL)

Through the present petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C., the petitioner seeks grant of regular bail in FIR No.107, dated 10.09.2016, registered under Sections 307, 323, 341, 506, 148, 149 and 34 IPC (challan presented under Sections 307, 323, 341, 506 and 34 IPC), at Police Station Dehlon, District Police Commissionerate, Ludhiana.

Seeking regular bail for the petitioner, learned counsel submits that the petitioner has been in custody for the last over 07 months; the injury attributed to him is on a non-vital part of the body of Kuldeep Singh; there is no other criminal case pending in which the petitioner is involved and that only charges have been framed and no witness has yet been examined, therefore, the trial is likely to take a long time to conclude.

Learned State counsel opposes the grant of bail on the ground that the petitioner has inflicted grievous injury to Kuldeep Singh

and was a part of a group of persons, who inflicted several injuries on Kuldeep Singh and Mandeep Singh.

Keeping in view the fact that the petitioner has been in custody for the last over 07 months; only charges have been framed; there is no other criminal case pending in which the petitioner is involved and that he has been attributed an injury on the non-vital part of the body of Kuldeep Singh, I am of the opinion that the petitioner deserves to be admitted to regular bail.

Bail to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

Nothing observed herein-above shall be considered to be an expression of opinion by this Court on the merits of the case.

If the petitioner is found indulging in any other criminal activity/misusing the concession of bail granted to him, it will be open to the State to move an appropriate application before the Competent Court/this Court for cancellation of the bail granted to the petitioner through this order.
