H.S. MADAAN, J. (Oral):

FIR No.13 dated 01.02.2017 under Section 302, 201 IPC was registered with Police Station Lalru District SAS Nagar, Mohali regarding murder of Jaswant Singh @ Jony, aged about 21 years. After registration of the FIR though the matter was investigated but the police has been unable to crack the case and to identify the persons responsible for such unnatural death of Jaswant Singh @ Jony. The petitioner Raj Kumar father of the deceased has approached this Court expressing his dissatisfaction with the investigation being conducted by police of Police Station Lalru and came up with a prayer for transfer of investigation to Central Bureau of Investigation.

Notice of the petition was given to the State, who has put in appearance, reply to the petition has been filed wherein it has been contended that despite best efforts the criminal who had committed crime could not be identified and further the three persons whom the petitioner suspected of being involved in the murder case were associated with the investigation and subjected to polygraph, brain mapping, narco analysis test and lie detector but without any success.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties and going through the file I find that no ground for transfer of investigation to CBI as per request of the petitioner is made out, simply for the reason that the investigation by the local police in the case has failed to reach any logical conclusion. It is directed that this incident be kept in mind while investigating the other cases and on getting some clue further investigation of the case be got conducted. With such observation the petitions stands disposed of accordingly.
